Purpose of Form

Use Form 8812 to figure the additional child tax credit.



The additional child tax credit may give you a refund even if you do not owe any tax.

Who Should Use Form 8812

First, complete the Child Tax Credit Worksheet that applies to you. See the instructions for Form 1040, line 47, or Form 1040A, line 30. Then, use the following chart to see if you should use Form 8812.

Railroad Employees

If you worked for a railroad, include the following taxes in the total on line 1 of Form 8812.

- Tier 1 tax withheld from your pay. This tax should be shown in box 14 of your W-2 form(s) and identified as "Tier 1 tax."
- If you were an employee representative, 50% of the total Tier 1 tax and Tier 1 Medicare tax you paid for 2000.
